What can be Recycled at Rumpke?

PAPER

Newspaper (including inserts & ads)
Magazines and catalogs
Phone books
Paperboard (cereal and gift boxes)
Junk mail
Cardboard (2'x2' pieces)
Drink boxes and other gable-top cartons



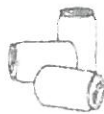
PLASTIC

All plastic bottles #1-7 (milk jugs, soda, water, detergent and shampoo bottles)



CANS

Aluminum beverage cans
Steel soup and food cans
Empty aerosol cans



GLASS

Clear, brown, green & blue glass bottles and jars



Unacceptable Items

pizza boxes
napkins & paper plates
plastic caps & lids
plastic bowls & buckets
oil jugs
plastic grocery bags
window glass
mirrors
light bulbs
drinking glasses
mugs
Pyrex
pots and pans
coat hangers
scrap steel
frozen food cartons
wax-coated plastic (yogurt cups)
wax paper
paint cans
clothing & batteries

FACT:
60 percent of the material that is thrown away could be recycled.

What Happens to my Recyclables?

Rumpke Recycling processes recyclables at our material recovery facility (MRF) in Dayton. The materials are sorted, baled and sold to manufacturers to be made into new products.

Paper is made into more paper products.

Plastic bottles are made into various plastic products including carpet, drainage tile, strapping and clothing.

Aluminum cans are made into more cans.

Steel cans are used to make new steel products, including car parts and construction materials.

Glass is reprocessed for use in fiberglass insulation.
